Supervisor Comments

The Town Board had an Attorney-Client session before the meeting to review two potential legal actions against the Town, and there will be an executive session at the end of the meeting to review a Tax Certiorari.

The number of Covid cases is stable. Please use common sense to protect yourself.

The Budget Committee of Councilwoman Morrison and the Supervisor are working on the numbers for 2023. It is a challenging year to budget, with inflation factors up 7% and a Tax Cap of 2%.

There is progress at the Town Highway Garage construction site! They've started to pour concrete for the building. Last month the Highway crew realigned the stream. They did a very good job and we appreciate that they were able to do it themselves.

Community Bulk Trash Day is this Saturday. Residents are invited to participate. The fees for various items are listed on a link on the Town website. We will also collect electronics for delivery to the following week's County collection.

We will host a workshop on tools to address the housing crisis on September 17th at the Library Annex. We were able to research what municipal officials have the ability to do, as a result of being awarded a mini-grant. There are limits to what a rural town can do. It is important to know what we can do. Nan Stolzenberg consulted and helped us. We are sharing the information with Amenia, Stanfordville, Pine Plains and the Village of Millerton, and the meeting is open to the public.

The Town continues to receive complaints regarding the Millerton Gun Club. Specifically, the concern is that the use of the gun club has changed: regarding numbers of members, size and caliber of the weapons. The gun club preceded our zoning laws and there is a limit to what the Town of North East can do.

Eddie Collins Park is being rebuilt. It is a resource for the community and there will be an October 1 Village & Town-wide party to celebrate the reopening. Information will be on the website.

We have been approached by at least one solar developer interested in exploring the landfill site. If the Town were to permit action, it could receive economic benefits. Supervisor Kennan is going to look into it.

We are also going to look into pop-up vendors and look into appropriate Peddler's permits for the Town.

Habitat for Humanity is interested in the $\frac{1}{2}$ acre lot but has not submitted a formal proposal yet.

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only: none

The Village of Millerton is proposing to have the water lines replaced or repaired. They are looking for grant money. They need our approval for that to move forward. Town needs to hold a public Hearing on whether or not to support the Village renovating its water lines. The water district is located in the Village but we have an inter-municipal agreement with the Village to service some residents in the Town. Attorney for the Village requests we conduct a Public hearing October 13 at 7:15 pm. The Village Mayor plans to be at the October meeting to review the hearing.

RESOLUTION NO. 522022

RESOLUTION AND ORDER CALLING PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF WATER DISTRICT FACLIITIES FOR TOWN OF NORTH EAST WATER DISTRICT NO. 1, IN THE TOWN OF NORTH EAST, IN THE COUNTY OF DUTCHESS, STATE OF NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO SECTION 202-b OF THE TOWN LAW

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of North East (herein called "Town Board" and "Town", respectively), in the County of Dutchess, New York, established the Town of North East Water District No. 1, in the Town (herein called "District") pursuant to a Resolution and Order dated as of December 28, 1995 and caused the installation of water improvements pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Town and the Village of Millerton (the "Village") entered into a Contract for the Supply of Water dated as of December 28, 1995, pursuant to which the Village agreed to provide a supply of water to the District as provided therein; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village, on behalf of Village Water System and the District No. 1, requested that T&B Engineering, P.C., engineers duly licensed by the State of New York (herein called "Engineer"), prepare a report assessing alternatives for the improvement of facilities of the water system including replacement of distribution facilities within the District; and

WHEREAS the Engineer has prepared a Preliminary Engineering Report dated as of November 2021, as amended June 17, 2022, as further amended September 6, 2022, describing certain water system improvements to include the replacement of water mains, replacement and improvement of equipment at the water treatment plant, including certain distribution lines located in the District, and including original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor, at an estimated maximum cost therefor not to exceed \$6,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the project cost is proposed to be financed by the Village pursuant to the Local Finance Law to be repaid by fees of the system users, and the Village and Town propose to jointly apply for a Water Infrastructure Improvement Grant to pay or reimburse a portion of such costs as provided in an Intermunicipal Agreement dated as of November 17, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid purpose constitutes replacement in kind, which constitutes a Type II action as defined under the State Environmental Quality Review Regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. A public hearing of the Town Board of the Town shall be held at the Town Hall in the Town on October 13, 2022 at 7:15 o'clock p.m. (Prevailing Time) pursuant to Section 202-b of the Town Law to consider said proposed improvement and modification of facilities of the District and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same and for such other action on the part of the Town Board with relation thereto as may be required by law.
- 2. The Town Clerk shall publish at least once in the Millerton News and the Poughkeepsie Journal, newspapers having a general circulation in the Town and hereby designated as the official newspapers of the Town for such publication, and post on the signboard of the Town maintained

pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, a notice in substantially the form attached hereto, the first publication thereof and posting to be not less than ten (10) days or more than twenty (20) days before the date of such public hearing.

3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that it may be necessary for the Town of North East to exceed the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of North East pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c for fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board by Resolution dated August 11, 2022 accepted a proposed Local Law to override the tax levy limits for fiscal year 2023 pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c for commencement of the Local Law adoption process; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board scheduled and duly noticed a public hearing on said Local Law to be held on September 8, 2022 at the Town of North East Town Hall; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board opened the public hearing and heard comments on said Local Law and closed the public hearing on September 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that this action is a Type II action under SEQRA and does not require environmental reviews; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town of North East to adopt this Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts Local Law No. 2 of 2022 entitled "A Local Law to Override the Tax Levy Limit for the Fiscal Year 2023 Pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c"; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to file said Local Law in the Office of the Department of State, as required by law.

- **Assessor:** Katherine Johnson, Town Assessor, reported that Residents who are paying school taxes for the Pine Plains and Taconic School districts had their taxes decrease this year. Webutuck School taxes went up 5% because of their budget, not because of their property assessment.

Changes in the Law announced by the State Legislation affects our senior exemption. Johnson shared a report with the Board members that covered NYS Real Property Tax Law section 467- Senior Citizen Exemption. Currently it helps seniors earning lower that \$29K, as a discount across the board on all their taxes. The State has proposed allowing an increase in the base level of qualification from 29K to 50K. Municipalities have to decide what level is right for their area. Feeling that it is time for a change, Johnson proposes a 34K level for our senior resident qualification by looking at two factors: the median household income of Dutchess County and Social Security increases over the last 10 years. She reminds us that for every exemption offered the money has to be made up somewhere else. Forty eight senior residents are in this program at 29K. Johnson asks that we create a local law or resolution with a public hearing early this fall so that any increased level of exemption can be applied to 2023 tax roll. She clarified that this is in addition to the Senior STAR exemption. Supervisor Kennan said that we would discuss this at the October meeting.

Supervisor Kennan asked if a revaluation was scheduled in the near future. Last year entailed a broad revaluation for the assessment increases. It's been since 2011 when the Assessor last did full individual assessments. Johnson is waiting for the real-estate boom to slow down.

The State is looking at a possible 9% increase in property valuations next year. She will be looking more closely at individual properties but nothing is scheduled at this point.

- **Town Clerk: Planning, Zoning, & Building Department:** Town Clerk, Tilly Strauss, provided the board members with Department reports before the meeting. The Animal Control officer's report for August was not submitted.

The Police report will be put on the Town website and sent to the Town Board

- Town Board Committee Activities

Recreation Committee- Councilwoman Morrison reminded that there is a reopening party for Eddie Collins Field on October 1.

Highway Committee- The Town Board made a site visit to the New Highway project just before the meeting

Cemetery Committee- The Friends of SCBG are cleaning monuments- it's a long process. Volunteers took "before photos" of 5 individual monuments and will return in 5 weeks to take "after photos", hoping the visual difference will help with fundraising. They are working on a site plan and spreadsheet of the 500 graves. The oldest grave dates back to 1701.

We support the work that NECC does- which is critical to our community. Kennan stated that we are lucky to have them in our midst. They fill the role of social services in a big way" The contract amount hasn't changed in 10 years.
